STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Cutler.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars
2 for the year 1903, and two hundred and fifty dollars for the
3 year 1904, be and hereby is appropriated to aid and assist
4 the town of Cutler, in the county of Washington, in repairing
5 highways and bridges in said town. Said sum to be expended
6 under the direction of an agent to be appointed by the gov-
7 ernor and council, who are hereby authorized to appoint such
8 agent.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Cutler is situate on the coast in Washington county. Its inhabitants are mostly fishermen. Population, according to last census, 565. Number of polls taxed, 191; number not taxed, 6. Rate of taxation, .044. Real estate, resident, \$45,960. Real estate, non-resident, \$23,617. Personal estate, resident, \$16,513. Personal estate, non-resident, \$425. Total valuation, \$86,515. Total amount assessed for taxes in 1901, \$4,188. Practically same amount was assessed for 1902. Said town has a debt of \$6,125. Said town has 40 miles of highway to keep in repair and several bridges also. Its largest bridge is Turner bridge, which is 30 feet or more between the approaches.
