STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to limit the number of fish that may be taken from Spring lake, in Somerset county, in one day.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or carry away 2 more than two fish of any kind, (eels and suckers excepted,)

- 3 or ten pounds of fish, in any one day from Spring lake, so
- 4 called, in Somerset county, under a penalty of not less than
- 5 ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each
- 6 offense and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish
- 7 caught, taken or killed in violation of this act.
