STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT closing Cupsuptic river and its tributaries to all fishing,
above the foot of the first falls near its mouth, from July first
to May first.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish at any time for any
2 kind of fish in the Cupsuptic river or its tributaries, above the
3 foot of the first falls near its mouth, except from May first
4 to July first of each year.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act
2 shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more
3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and a further
4 penalty of one dollar for each fish caught, taken or killed in
5 violation of this act.
