## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.


AN ACT prohibiting the use of boats or launches of any kind propelled by steam, naphtha, gasoline, or electricity, while hunting sea birds in the waters of Frenchman's bay, so called, on the coast of Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

egislature assembled, as follows:

- Section I. It shall be unlawful for any person at any time
- 2 to use boats or launches of any kind propelled by steam,
- 3 naphtha, gasoline, or electricity, or any other mode than the
- 4 ordinary sail boat or row boat, in chasing, hunting or gun-
- 5 ning any sea birds, duck or water fowl in any of the waters
- 6 of Frenchman's bay, so called, on the coast of Maine, under
- 7 a penalty of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than
- 8 one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution for each offense.

Sect. 2. For the purposes of this act Frenchman's bay is 2 defined and bounded as follows: On the north by the towns 3 of Hancock and Sullivan; on the east by the towns of Goulds-4 boro and Winter Harbor; on the south by Mt. Desert island 5 and a straight line from Schoodic point, so called, to Great 6 Head, so called; on the west by Thompson's toll bridge.
