STATE OF MAINE,

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to prohibit all ice fishing in Lake Webb or Weld pond, so called, in the town of Weld, county of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
- 2 kill any kind of fish in Lake Webb or Weld pond, so called,
- 3 in the town of Weld, Franklin county, between October first
- 4 and May first of the following year.
 - Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act
- 2 shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more than
- 3 thirty dollars and costs for each offense and a further fine of
- 4 one dollar for each fish caught, taken or killed in violation
- 5 of this law.
