RESOLVE in favor of the town of Jackson.

Resolved, That there be paid to the town of Jackson the sum
2 of seventy-nine dollars and sixty cents, (\$79.60), to reimburse
3 the town for its loss of State school fund to that amount, on
4 account of an error in the enumeration of persons between the
5 ages of four and twenty-one on April 1, 1901.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

I, N. A. Webb of Jackson, Waldo county, Maine, on oath depose and say that an error was made in the school census for the town of Jackson for the year 1901. Namely that the number of scholars between the ages of 4 and 21 years residing in said town on the first day of April, 1901, was reported to be 94 (ninety-four), whereas it should have been 124 (one hundred twenty-four.)
