STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND 'THREE.

AN ACT to abolish issuing separate executions for costs by Disclosure Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. No separate execution for costs or for costs and 2 fees, in disclosure proceedings, shall be issued against any 3 judgment debtor by any disclosure commissioner or by any 4 commissioner or magistrate authorized to hear disclosures, 5 except as hereafter provided; but when the petitioner recovers 6 costs or costs and fees against the judgment debtor, either on 7 hearing, default, or otherwise, the commissioner or magis-8 trate shall tax such costs or costs and fees in detail, and make

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9 a record thereof, and under his hand and official seal shall 10 indorse upon or annex to the execution in force at the time 11 of disclosure, hearing or default, a certificate certifying that 12 the petitioner has recovered costs or costs and fees and stating 13 therein, in detail, the costs or costs and fees recovered, and 14 also the date of such recovery. A copy of said certificate 15 shall be indorsed upon or annexed to every subsequent execu-16 tion issued upon the same judgment, or upon any judgment 17 founded thereon. Costs or costs and fees recovered, taxed 18 and certified, as aforesaid, shall be deemed a part of the origi-19 nal judgment for costs recovered against the judgment debtor.

Sect. 2. Any and all separate executions for costs or for 2 costs and fees, legally issued by any disclosure commissioner 3 or magistrate before this act takes effect, may be renewed as 4 now provided by law.

Sect. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this 2 act are hereby repealed.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect on the first day of Jan-2 uary, nineteen hundred and four. .
