STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT for the protection of shore birds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person not a bona fide resident 2 of this State, and actually domiciled therein, to hunt, pursue, 3 chase, or kill any teal, ducks, sea or shore birds without first 4 having procured a license therefor as hereinafter provided. 5 Such licenses shall be issued by the commissioners of inland 6 fisheries and game, upon application in writing and the pay-7 ment of five dollars, and under such rules and regulations 8 to be established by them, and approved by the Governor and 9 Council, as may be required to carry out the true intent of 10 this act and not inconsistent herewith.

All money received for such licenses shall be forthwith paid 12 to the State treasurer, and then expended by the commis-13 sioners in the protection of the birds above named under the 14 direction of the Governor and Council.

Whoever is found guilty of violating any of the provisions 16 of this act shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25.00 17 nor more than \$100.00 and costs for each offense. c .
