STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to prohibit the use of any kind of horns, cow bells or
other bells, cymbals, or tambourines, in hunting wild animals
in the county of Hancock.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, at any time,
2 to hunt, chase, or pursue any deer or other wild animal in
3 the county of Hancock with any kind of a horn, cow bell or
4 other bell, cymbals, tambourines, or by any other method
5 than by the ordinary method of hunting with firearms.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act
2 shall be liable to the same penalty as is now provided by law
3 for the illegal hunting, chasing or killing of deer.
