STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section 48 of chapter 284 of the public laws of 1891 entitled an act to consolidate and simplify the laws pertaining to sea and shore fisheries as contained in chapter forty of the Revised Statutes and in amendments and additions thereto.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. That section 48 of chapter 284 of the public laws 2 of 1901, nineteen hundred and one, are hereby amended by 3 striking out the word "fifteenth" in the twenty-sixth line and

4 inserting therefor the word 'thirtieth' so that said section as 5 amended will read as follows:

'No smelts shall be taken or fished for in tidal waters except 7 by hook and line between the first days of April and October 8 under a penalty of not less than ten nor more than thirty dol-9 lars for each offense, and a further penalty of twenty cents 10 for each smelt so taken, and all weirs for the capture of smelts 11 shall be open and so remain, and all nets used in the smelt 12 and tom cod fishery shall be taken from the water on or before 13 the first day of April under a penalty of not less than twenty 14 nor more than fifty dollars and a further fine of five dollars 15 for each day that any such weir or net remains in violation 16 of law. But weirs with catch pounds covered with nets, the 17 meshes of which are one inch in the clear, or greater, are 18 not subject to this section. But no smelts caught in such 19 weirs after the first day of April shall be sold or offered for 20 sale in this State nor shall smelts caught in any manner 21 between the first day of April and the first day of October 22 following be offered for sale, sold, or shipped from the State 23 under a penalty of twenty-five dollars for each offense, pro-24 vided however that dip nets may be used between the first day 25 of April and the first day of May and all smelts caught by dip 26 nets between said days may be lawfully offered for sale and 27 sold in this State, provided further that this section does not 28 apply to smelts taken in the Androscoggin river above the 29 Merrymeeting bav bridge between the first days of October 30 and November. Nor to smelts taken in the Penobscot river 31 and its tributaries between the first and thirtieth days of April. 32 Nor to smelts taken in Casco bay between the fifteenth day of

- 33 September and the first day of October, nor to smelts taken in
- 34 Taunton bay between the first day of April and the first day
- 35 of May nor smelts taken in Little Kennebec bay, so called, in
- 36 the county of Washington between the first day of April and
- 37 the first day of May.'
 - Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
