STATE OF MAINE.

Amend resolve in favor of University of Maine by adding thereto the following:

This appropriation is made on condition that the University discontinue its courses in Latin and Greek, opened in 1896 and 1899, and the degrees of bachelor of arts and bachelor of philosophy to which these courses lead; inasmuch as they duplicate work done in the three other colleges of the State at no expense to the State beyond exemption from taxation; and that the university confine itself hereafter to the agricultural, mechanical, technical and professional courses, for which it was especially intended, and which, if thoroughly done, will absorb all the aid the State can afford to bestow.
