STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Western State Normal School at Gorham.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum

- 2 of five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and
- 3 three and ten thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred
- 4 and four for the Western State Normal School at Gorham,
- 5 the same to be expended by and under the direction of the
- 6 trustees of the normal schools of the State.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This appropriation is asked to pay for putting electricity into the dormitory and repairs which it was necessary to make for the protection of the buildings for which no appropriation has heretofore been made; the purchase of a lot of land adjoining the school buildings, and the building and equipment of an addition to the school building and making such necessary repairs as may be required during the next two years.
