IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section 3 of chapter 30 of the Private and Special Laws of 1872, relating to the Godfrey Falls Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 3 of chapter 30 of the Private and Special

- 2 Laws of 1872 is hereby amended by adding after the word
- 3 "boom" in the seventeenth line the following, 'or their place
- 4 of sale or manufacture,' and by adding after the word "may"
- 5 in said seventeenth line the words 'then, or at any time there-
- 6 after,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:
- 'Sect. 3. Said corporation may demand and receive as a toll 8 the sum of seventy-five cents for each and every thousand

9 feet board measure of all logs and lumber cut not more than 10 thirty feet in length and two dollars for each and every thou-11 sand feet board measure of all logs and lumber more than 12 thirty feet in length put into the lakes, ponds and streams 13 above their dam at or near the head of Godfrey's Falls, and 14 which may pass over their dam at, or near, the head of said 15 Godfrey's Falls, to be ascertained by the woods scale or boom 16 scale at the option of said corporation; and said corporation 17 shall have a lien upon all logs and lumber which may pass 18 over said dam at or near the head of said Godfrev's Falls 19 until the full amount of toll of all the logs and lumber which 20 may pass over said dam at or near the head of said Godfrey's 21 Falls is paid; but logs of a particular mark shall only be 22 holden to pay the toll of such mark; and if said toll is not 23 paid within ten days after such logs and lumber shall arrive 24 at the Penobscot boom or at their place of sale or manufacture 25 said corporation may then, or at any time thereafter, sell at 26 public auction in Bangor after ten days' notice in some news-27 paper printed in Bangor so much of said logs and lumber as 28 may be sufficient to pay said toll and incidental charges.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
