STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to fix the salary of the Secretary of State.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. On and after January first, A. D. nineteen hun-2 dred and four, the salary of the secretary of state shall be 3 three thousand dollars in full for all official services, and all 4 fees received by him shall be accounted for and paid over to 5 the treasurer of state.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
