STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section eight of chapter one hundred and fifteen of the Revised Statutes relating to compensation of members of the government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section eight is hereby amended by striking out,

- 2 after the word "receive" in the tenth line, the words "one hun-
- 3 dred and fifty" and inserting in lieu thereof the words 'three
- 4 hundred,' and by striking out in the nineteenth line, after the
- 5 word "receive" the words "three hundred" and insert in place
- 6 thereof the words 'five hundred,' so that said section, as
- 7 amended, shall read as follows:

'Each member of the executive council shall receive the same 9 compensation and travel as a representative to the legislature, 10 for serving as a councillor during the session of the council 11 commencing in January and closing immediately after the 12 adjournment of the legislature. For services at other sessions of the council, each councillor shall be paid two dollars 14 for every day's actual attendance, and two dollars for every 15 ten miles travel, one way, from his place of abode to the Cap-16 itol; and for authorized service on committees, when the 17 council is not in session, three dollars and a half a day and 18 necessary expenses.

'Each member of the senate and house of representatives 20 shall receive three hundred dollars for the regular session of 21 the legislature, and two dollars for every ten miles travel from 22 his place of abode, once in each session. He is entitled to 23 mileage on the first day of the session, and fifty dollars of his 24 salary on the first day of each month thereafter, during the 25 session, and the balance at the end thereof; but two dollars 26 shall be deducted from the pay of every member for each day 27 that he is absent from his duties, without being excused by 28 the house to which he belongs. The president of the senate 29 and speaker of the house of representatives, shall receive five 30 hundred dollars for each session, with the same mileage as 31 other members, and subject to the same deduction in case of 32 absence. Any member acting as president pro tempore of 33 the senate, or speaker pro tempore of the house, shall receive 34 two dollars a day extra therefor.

'When an extra session is called by the governor, the mem-36 bers of the senate and house of representatives shall each be 37 paid two dollars for every day's attendance, and mileage as . 38 aforesaid.

'The president of the senate and speaker of the house of 40 representatives at such extra session, shall receive, in addition, 41 two dollars for every day's attendance.

'The secretary of the senate and the clerk of the house of 43 representatives, six hundred dollars each in full for all ser-44 vices. Assistant secretary and assistant clerk, three hundred 45 dollars each, in full for all services. Messenger and assistant 46 messengers to senate and to house, one hundred and fifty dol-47 lars for each, in full.

'Pages to the senate and to the house of representatives, 49 seventy-five dollars for each, in full.

'Messenger to governor and council, five hundred dollars, 51 in full for all services and travel.

'The salaries of all public officers and the pay of all clerks 53 in public offices not otherwise provided for, shall be from the 54 state treasury, in quarterly payments.

'The treasurer of state shall make pay rolls and payments 56 according to these provisions.'

Sect. 2. This act shall be referred at the next state election 2 to the voters of the state and shall take effect when approved 3 by them.
