RESOLVE in favor of town of Canton.

Resolved, That the sum of ten thousand dollars be and
2 hereby is appropriated to aid the town of Canton in the county
3 of Oxford in purchasing the toll bridge across the Andros-
4 coggin river in said Canton.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The toll bridge in the town of Canton is a steel bridge in good condition, having been built in 1896 by a private corporation. Soon after the bridge was built the large pulp mill in Canton village was burned and has never been rebuilt, and in consequence said bridge has never been a paying investment and can now be bought at a comparatively low figure. The bridge and abutments cost twenty thousand dollars in round numbers, of which the town and citizens contributed two thousand dollars.
