STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to provide for the appointment of a commission to investigate the causes of floods and over-flows of rivers and water courses, and storage water, and to make recommendations for preventing floods and for storing water, and to make an appropriation therefor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. The governor is authorized to appoint within
- 2 thirty days after the passage of this act three citizens of the
- 3 State, who, together with the forest commissioner and the
- 4 attorney general, shall constitute a commission to be known
- 5 as the water storage commission.
 - Sect. 2. The water storage commissioners herein provided
- 2 for, shall, before entering upon the discharge of their duties,
- 3 take and subscribe the constitutional oath of office and file the
- 4 same in the office of the secretary of State.

The forest commissioner and attorney general shall serve 6 without pay, but they shall be paid their necessary expenses, 7 incurred in the performance of their duties.

The three commissioners appointed by the governor shall be 9 paid so much per diem, the amount to be fixed by the governor 10 and council, for the time actually employed in the service of 11 the commission. They shall also be allowed their actual and 12 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their 13 duties.

The office of said commission shall be at the capitol, in the 15 city of Augusta.

The said board may appoint a secretary, who shall be paid 17 a salary not to exceed twelve hundred dollars per year.

The board may employ such engineers and surveyors and 19 other assistants as may be found advisable, and the compensation of persons so employed shall be paid from the moneys 14 herein provided.

- Sect. 3. The commissioners when so appointed, shall pro2 ceed at once to make such surveys and investigations as may
 3 be proper to determine the causes of the over-flow of the
 4 various rivers and water courses of the State, and the best
 5 method of storing the surplus water of the various rivers and
 6 water courses, and to determine what, if anything, can be done
 7 to prevent floods and freshets and to devise the best means of
 8 conserving the surplus water of the various rivers and water
 9 courses.
- Sect. 4. The commission shall report in writing to the legis-2 lature, on or before the first Wednesday of January, 1905, and 3 file in the office of the State land agent, all maps, plans, and 4 surveys, and transmit to the legislature with its report, such 5 recommendations as it may have to make, and from and after 6 such date, said commission shall cease to exist.
- Sect. 5. The sum of five thousand dollars, or so much 2 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from any

- 3 moneys in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, for the 4 purposes of said commission.
 - Sect. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.
