STATE OF MAINE.

JOINT RESOLUTION.

"Whereas, article V of the Constitution of the United States 2 provides that 'the congress, whenever two-thirds of both 3 houses shall deem it necessary, shall propose amendments to 4 this constitution, or on the application of the legislatures of 5 two-thirds of the several states shall call a convention for 6 proposing amendments, which in either case shall be valid 7 to all intents and purposes as part of this constitution, when 8 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several 9 states, or by convention in three-fourths thereof,' etc., there-to fore, be it

"Resolved, By the senate and house of representatives of the 12 State of Maine that, under the authority of article V of the 13 Constitution of the United States, application is hereby made

14 to congress to forthwith call a constitutional convention for 15 the purpose of submitting to the states for ratification, an 16 amendment to the federal constitution providing for the electron of United States senators by direct vote of the people; 18 and,

"Resolved, That the secretary of the State be, and is, hereby 20 directed to forward a properly authenticated copy of these 21 resolutions to the president of the United States, to the president of the senate of the United States, and to the speaker of 23 the house of representatives of the United States."
