STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to establish a law uniform with other states relative to

Insurance Policies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. No policy of insurance shall be rendered invalid
- 2 by reason of any statement, representation or warranty made
- 3 by the insured unless the same shall be material to the risk or
- 4 made with intent to defraud.
- Sect. 2. No policy of insurance shall contain any condition,
- 2 provision or agreement which shall, directly or indirectly,
- 3 deprive the insured or the beneficiary of the right of trial by
- 4 jury on any question of fact arising under said policy, and all
- 5 such conditions, provisions or agreements shall be void.

Sect. 3. This act shall apply to certificates of fraternal and 2 mutual benefit, as well as to all other forms of insurance.

Sect. 4. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith, 2 are hereby repealed.
