STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Ebenezer O. Gerry.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the
2 State to Ebenezer O. Gerry, of Dover, Maine, four dollars
3 (4.00) per month during the pleasure of the Legislature, on
4 account of service as a soldier in the Aroostook war. Said
5 pension of four dollars (4.00) per month commencing from
6 and after the approval of this resolve.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Ebenezer O. Gerry is a resident of the town of Dover; is a man 85 years of age, who is in feeble health, poor circumstances financially; was a private of a drafted militia of Maine, Capt. Chas. R. Hamblet's Company of Infantry. He was called into actual service in midwinter on the twentieth day of February, 1839, and saw service during the Aroostook war, in that year, on the northeastern frontier, and received an honorable discharge.
