STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to authorize the Orono Pulp and Paper Company to generate, use and sell electricity.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. The Orono Pulp and Paper Company is hereby 2 specially authorized and empowered to make and generate 3 electricity upon its property situated upon the Stillwater 4 branch of the Penobscot river in Old Town, in Penobscot

- 5 county, and to carry and conduct such electricity to and into
- 6 the cities of Old Town, Bangor and Brewer, and the towns of
- 7 Orono and Veazie, and to use the same in all ways for its
- 8 own purposes, and to sell the same for power purposes in
- 9 units of not less than twenty-five horse power, and for heating

- Sect. 2. Said company is hereby authorized and empowered 2 to build and operate manufacturies and works for generating 3 and making electricity upon its said property, and may erect 4 poles in any and all streets and ways in said cities and towns 5 and may construct, lay, maintain and operate lines of wire or 6 other material for the transmission of such electricity, under 7 and across any stream or river, and under, upon, along and 8 over any and all streets, ways and bridges in any and all said 9 cities and towns.
- Sect. 3. In erecting poles and lines of wire said corporation 2 shall be subject to the general laws of the State applicable to 3 corporations which are authorized to make, generate, sell, 4 distribute and supply electricity for manufacturing purposes, 5 and shall have all the rights and powers of such corporations 6 in the erection of poles and the construction, laying and main-7 taining lines of wire.
 - Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
