STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Mary C. Rankin, widow of Orlenzo
K. Rankin, late of Co. K, 1st New England Regiment,
Mexican War.

Resolved, That a pension be allowed Mary C. Rankin of
2 Liberty, of eight dollars per month from the first day of
3 January, nineteen hundred and three.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mary C. Rankin, widow of Orlando K. Rankin, late of Co. K, 1st New England Regiment, (Mexican War), is eighty-four years old. She has no property and no means of a support except a United States pension of eight dollars per month. Her condition is such that she requires the personal care and attention of another person, for which she pays two dollars per week.

This widow has one son, but he has no property, and has never rendered her any assistance, and there is no one legally bound for her support. Her health is such that it would be reasonable to presume that she would not need assistance only for a short time.
