## STATE OF MAINE.

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.


AN ACT to amend section three (3) of chapter one hundred and three (103) of the Public Laws of 1895, relating to the incorporation and control of telegraph and telephone companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section three (3) of chapter one hundred and 2 three (103) of the Public Laws of 1895 is hereby amended 3 by adding thereto the following provision, viz.: Provided, 4 however, that all that part of this section after the word 5 "incorporation" in the fourth line thereof shall not apply to 6 telegraph and telephone companies organized hereunder, in 7 country places, which do not operate their lines for profit, 8 or public service, so that said section as amended shall read 9 as follows:

#### SENATE-No. 20.

'Sect. 3. Corporations organized under the provisions of 11 this act shall have authority, except as herein limited, to con-12 struct, maintain and operate its lines upon and along the 13 route or routes and between the points stated in its certificate 14 of incorporation. But no corporation organized hereunder 15 shall have authority without special act of the legislature, 16 to construct its lines along the route or routes, used or 17 authorized to be used, by any other telegraph or telephone 18 company, person or firm, or between points connected, or 19 authorized to be connected, by the lines of any such com-20 pany, person or firm, unless it shall first obtain the consent 21 of such other company, person or firm. Provided, however, 22 that all that part of this section after the word "incorporation" 23 in the fourth line thereof, shall not apply to telegraph and 24 telephone companies organized hereunder, in country places, 25 which do not operate their lines for profit or public service.'
