STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the Maine General Hospital.

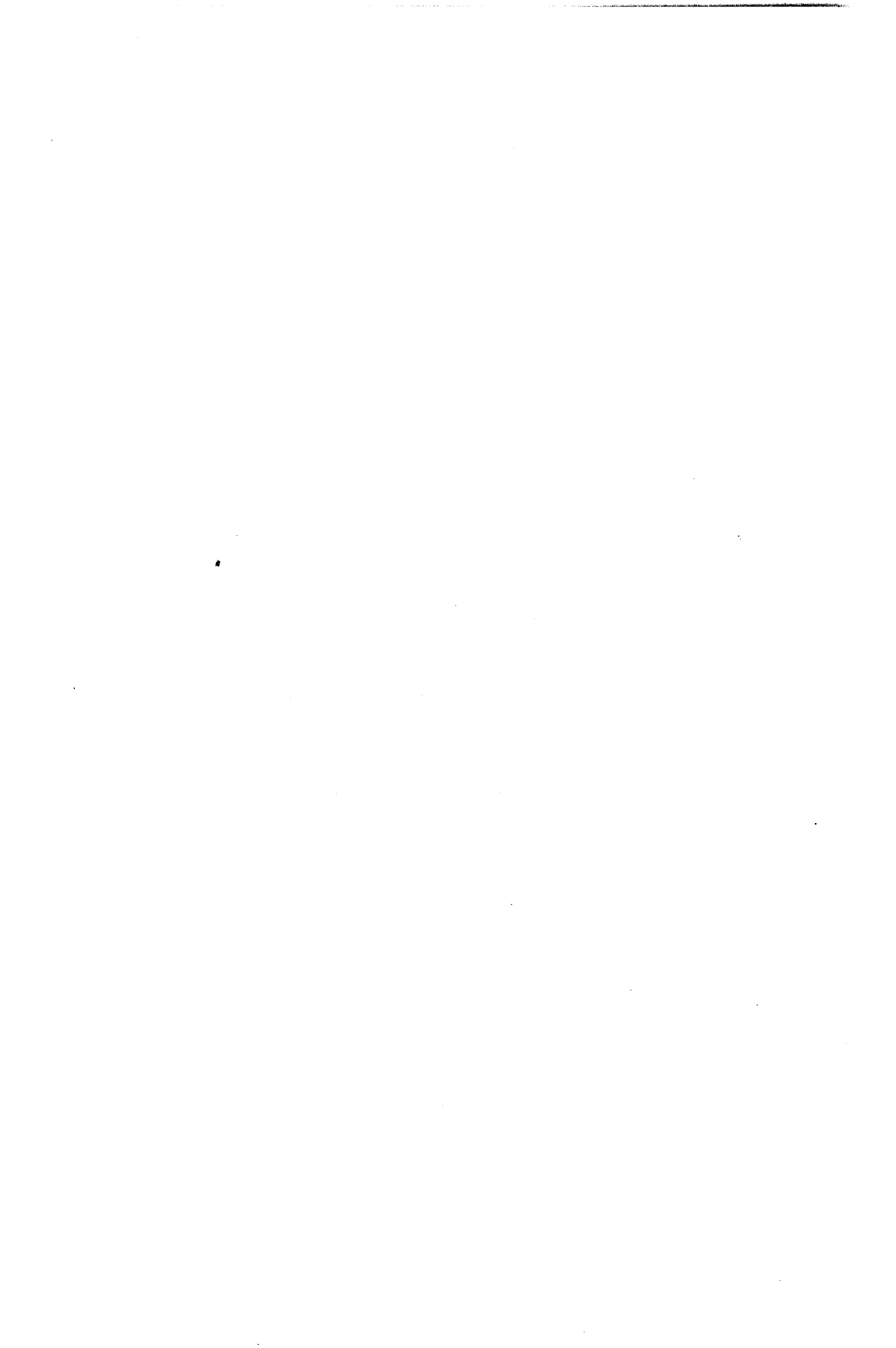
*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The Maine General Hospital at an annual meet-
2 ing of the corporation is hereby authorized, if it shall so
3 determine, to increase the number of its directors from nine
4 to twelve.

If the corporation shall decide to increase the number of
6 its directors as aforesaid, it shall at the same annual meeting
7 elect four directors, two of them to hold office for the term
8 of three years, and two of them to hold office for the term of
9 four years. Thereafterwards, annually, two directors shall
10 be chosen by the corporation for the term of four years.

Otherwise the provisions of existing law relating to the
12 hospital remain unchanged, except that when such increase
13 in the number of its directors has been made by the hospital,
14 the visitors shall appoint one additional director to hold office
15 for the term of four years, and at the expiration of the term
16 of any director appointed by the visitors they shall appoint
17 annually one person to be a director for four years, so that
18 the number of directors appointed by the visitors shall be
19 four with terms corresponding to the terms of the directors
20 chosen by the corporation.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
