STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to ratify certain doings of the Eliot Bridge Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. All of the corporate acts of the Eliot Bridge 2 Company at its meetings held in the State of New Hampshire 3 are hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.
 - Sect. 2. The votes, acts and doings of the said company
 - 2 in empowering the Eliot Bridge Company of New Hampshire
 - 3 to erect, maintain, own and operate the entire bridge au-
 - 4 thorized by the legislatures of Maine and New Hampshire
 - 5 to be so erected and owned by both of said corporations are
 - 6 hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid and in uniting
 - 7 with the said Eliot Bridge Company of New Hampshire by
 - 8 admitting the stockholders thereof as associate members of

9 the Eliot Bridge Company of this state are hereby ratified, 10 confirmed and made valid.

- Sect. 3. The Eliot Bridge Company, so incorporated 2 under the laws of New Hampshire, is hereby declared to be 3 a corporation of this state so far as may be necessary to 4 exercise within this state the franchises appertaining to said 5 bridge.
- Sect. 4. The Eliot Bridge Company, incorporated 2 under the laws of this State, is hereby authorized to hold 3 meetings within the state of New Hampshire.
 - Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
