STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES providing for the preservation of Regimental Rolls
in the adjutant general's office.

Resolved, That the adjutant general is hereby authorized and
2 directed under the advice and control of the governor and
3 council to provide for the preservation of the enlistment,
4 descriptive and muster rolls, and the monthly returns of the
5 regiments and batteries in the War of the Rebellion, now on
6 file in the adjutant general's office.

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand four hundred
8 dollars for the year nineteen hundred and three, and two
9 thousand four hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred
10 and four, is hereby appropriated for the preservation of said
11 rolls.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

These resolves are substantially a renewal of the resolves approved February 13, 1901, for two thousand four hundred dollars for each of the years nineteen hundred and one and nineteen hundred and two. It has been found that this appropriation carried the work of preserving the rolls of the organizations from this State serving in the War of the Rebellion through a period of two years, making the cost two hundred dollars per month.
