STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT consenting to the purchase by the United States of
land lying in Hancock county, in the State of Maine, and
ceding jurisdiction over the same.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section I. The consent of the legislature of the State of
2 Maine is hereby given to the acquisition by the United States
3 of title to the following described lands and premises for a
4 naval depot for coal, or other naval uses: All those certain
5 parcels and tracts of land, situated on Frenchman's bay, in
6 the town of Lamoine, county of Hancock, State of Maine,
7 conveyed to the United States by Alden B. Higgins, Harry
8 M. Higgins, Haltie M. Higgins, Alice A. Higgins, Harriet
9 T. Higgins, Henry W. Higgins, Mary E. Gault, George W.
10 Gault, Fannie C. Saunders, Hutson B. Saunders, Winfield S.

11 Hodgkins, John A. Peters, Junior, and Calvin Y. Huckins,
12 and containing sixty-one acres, more or less.

Sect. 2. That exclusive jurisdiction, subject to the restric-
2 tions hereinafter mentioned, over the lands and premises
3 above described and acquired and over the water adjacent
4 thereto, is hereby ceded to the United States.

Sect. 3. The jurisdiction hereby ceded shall continue so
2 long only as the United States shall own said lands and prem-
3 ises; and such consent is given and jurisdiction ceded on the
4 express condition that the State of Maine shall retain con-
5 current jurisdiction with the United States, in and over said
6 lands and water, so far as may be necessary or proper, for the
7 purpose of executing thereon any process, civil or criminal,
8 issued under the authority of this State, except as such
9 process might affect the property of the United States.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
