RESOLVE in favor of Matthias Cullnan of Belfast.

Resolved, That Matthias Cullnan of Belfast, late of Co. H,

- 2 1st Maine Militia National Guards, be granted an increase
- 3 of pension, so that he shall receive eight dollars per month,
- 4 instead of four dollars per month, which he is now receiving.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

To the Honorable, the Senators and Representatives of Maine in Legislature assembled:

Your petitioner respectfully represents that I was a sergeant in Co. H, First Regiment, of Maine Militia, National Guards, in the year 1877, and while at muster at Augusta, Maine, September 13th of said year, while carrying the colors, I being appointed regiment color bearer, I was prostrated by the heat and have suffered with the asthma since. I am unable to do any manual labor, I have no property, nothing to live on only four dollars a month I get from the State.

I respectfully ask your Honorable Bodies to increase my pension to eight dollars a month, and in duty bound shall ever pray.
