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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

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AN ACT to amend chapter ninety-seven of the Public Laws of  
eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, relating to assessment of  
damages resulting from the raising and lowering of ways.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section one of chapter ninety-seven of the  
2 Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, is hereby  
3 amended, by adding at the end of said section the following  
4 words: 'Said complaint to be filed at the term of the  
5 supreme judicial court, next to be held within the county  
6 where the land is situated, after sixty days from the date of  
7 assessment.' So that said section as amended shall read as  
8 follows:

‘Sect. 1. When a way or street is raised or lowered by a  
10 surveyor or person authorized, to the injury of an owner  
11 of adjoining land, he may, within a year, apply in writing  
12 to the municipal officers and they shall view such way or  
13 street and assess the damages, if any have been occasioned  
14 thereby, to be paid by the town, and any person aggrieved  
15 by said assessment, may, in addition to any other remedy  
16 now provided by law, have them determined, on complaint  
17 to the supreme judicial court, in the manner prescribed in  
18 section eighteen of this chapter, as amended by section five  
19 of chapter three hundred and fifty-nine of the laws of  
20 eighteen hundred and eighty-five, said complaint to be filed  
21 in the county where the land is situated, after sixty days from  
22 the date of assessment.’

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
