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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

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AN ACT in aid of the Soldiers of the Aroostook War.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Any citizen of Maine who has served in the  
2 drafted quota of the militia in the Aroostook War, has been  
3 honorably discharged and has been unable from his own re-  
4 sources to obtain a livelihood for himself and those dependent  
5 upon him, shall be entitled to a pension from the State of  
6 Maine of four dollars a month. The same shall be paid in  
7 accordance with the regulations provided in sections four,  
8 five, six and seven of chapter one hundred and forty-four of  
9 the revised statutes and acts additional thereto and amenda-  
10 tory thereof.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.



Senate Documents Nos. 10 and 12, with all accompanying papers, be recommitted to the committee on pensions with instructions to report forthwith a bill to pension all poor, needy and deserving soldiers of the Aroostook war at a rate not exceeding four dollars per month.
