STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend paragraph five of section sixty-two of chapter eighty-one of the Revised Statutes, relating to property exempt from attachment and execution.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows: **

Section 1. Paragraph five of section sixty-two of chapter 2 eighty-one of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by 3 inserting after the word "potatoes" in the third line of said 4 paragraph the words 'and other provisions' and by inserting 5 after the word "bought" in the same line of said paragraph 6 the words 'and necessary.' So that said paragraph will read 7 as follows:

'Sect. 62. Paragraph V. All produce of farms until har-
9 vested; one barrel of flour; corn and grain necessary for him-
10 self and family, not exceeding thirty bushels; all potatoes
11 and other provisions raised or bought, and necessary for
12 himself and family; and all flax raised on one-half acre of
13 land, and all articles manufactured therefrom for the use
14 of himself and family.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
