## STATE OF MAINE.

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT relating to the compensations of Examining Boards.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. The members of the board of registration in 2 medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, and of examiners of appli-3 cants for admission to the bar shall each receive, as compen-4 sation for their services, five dollars a day for the time actu-5 ally spent, and their necessary expenses incurred in the dis-6 charge of their duties, to be certified by the clerks of the 7 respective boards and audited by the governor and council. 8 The secretary of each board may also be allowed extra com-9 pensation for books, stationery, postage and other necessary 10 expenses actually incurred. All sums of money received 11 from applicants for examination shall be accounted for and 12 paid quarterly to the treasurer of state.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
