STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend section 1, chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes, in relation to the appointment of Clerks of the Judicial Courts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I of chapter 79 of the Revised Statutes is hereby 2 amended so as to read as follows: 'Clerks of the judicial 3 courts shall hereafter be appointed by and hold office during 4 the pleasure of the justices of the supreme judicial court, or 5 a majority thereof; but all such clerks now in office shall 6 continue to hold their said office until the expiration of the 7 term for which they were appointed or elected or until a 8 vacancy occurs from some other cause. All such clerks shall 9 be residents of the county for which they are appointed.'
