IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

---

AN ACT to amend section 6 of chapter 267 of the Public Laws of 1893, entitled "An Act to provide for the printing and distributing ballots at the public expense and to regulate voting for State and City Elections.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Said section six is hereby further amended by inserting after 2 the word "held" in said section the following words: 'and 3 for candidates for electors of president and vice president on 4 or before the tenth day of October in each year when such 5 election is held,' so that said section as amended shall read as 6 follows:

'Sect. 6. Certificates of nominations and nomination papers 8 for the nomination of candidates for State and county officers 9 and representatives to the legislature shall be filed with the

10 secretary of State on or before the tenth day of August of  
11 each year in which such election is held, and for candidates  
12 for electors of president and vice president on or before the  
13 tenth of October in each year when such election is held.  
14 Such certificates and papers for the nomination of candidates  
15 for the offices of mayor and all other offices in cities shall be  
16 filed with the city clerks of the respective cities at least seven  
17 days, exclusive of Sundays, previous to the day of such elec-  
18 tion. With nomination papers and certificates shall also be  
19 filed the consent in writing of the person nominated.'
