IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend chapter three, section fifty-nine, paragraph twelve of the Revised Statutes relating to dealers in old junk.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter three, section fifty-nine, paragraph twelve of the
2 Revised Statutes relating to dealers in old junk is hereby
3 amended by inserting in the second line of said section the
4 words 'and dealers in second hand articles and the pawning
5 of articles with pawnbrokers,' and in the third line of said
6 section the words 'pawners and pawnbrokers,' so that said
7 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 59. Cities may establish ordinances regulating the
9 purchase and sale of articles usually bought by old junk
10 dealers and dealers in second hand articles, and the pawning
11 of articles with pawnbrokers, and may therein prescribe con-

12 ditions to be observed by buyers and sellers, pawners and
13 pawnbrokers, to prevent or detect the sale or purchase of
14 stolen goods; and suitable penalties may be prescribed in such
15 ordinances.'
