
AN ACT to prevent the throwing of sawdust and other mill waste into all tributaries of Seven-Tree pond and rawford pond in Union and Warren.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person or persons shall put, or allow the 2 same to be done by any person within his employ, any saw-3 dust, shavings, bark, or other mill waste, into any of the 4 tributaries of Seven-Tree pond, in Union, in the county of 5 Knox, or in any of the tributaries of Crawford pond, in Union 6 and Warren, in said Knox county, or place or deposit such 7 mill waste, or other refuse, along the banks in such a manner 8 that the same shall fall or be washed into said brooks or 9 streams.

Sect. 2. Any person violating the provisions of section one 2 of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than five 3 dollars and not more than fifty dollars and costs for each 4 offense.
