STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT creating a close time on the tributaries to Indian, South and Twitchell ponds, and on Indian pond, in Greenwood, and the tributaries to Bryant pond in Woodstock, in the county of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, at any time,
- 2 to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish in any of the
- 3 tributaries to Indian pond South pond and Twitchell pond,
- 4 situated in the town of Greenwood, or the tributaries to
- 5 Bryant pond in the town of Woodstock.
- Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take,
- 2 catch or kill any kind of fish in Indian pond, above named,
- 3 for three years from April first, 1903.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act 2 shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the gen-3 era! law for illegal fishing.
