STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend chapter 101, Public Laws of 1887, relating to paupers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 101 of the Public Laws of 1887 is 2 hereby amended by inserting after the word "found" in the 3 second line the words 'in any town or,' so that said chapter 4 when amended may read as follows:

'Chapter 101. Whenever persons who have no legal settle-6 ment within the State, and needing immediate relief, are 7 found in any town, or in unincorporated places and are 8 brought into an adjoining town obliged by law to care for 9 and furnish relief to such persons, and relief is so furnished,

10 the State shall reimburse said town for such relief so fur11 nished, in the same manner and under the same restrictions
12 as provided in section twenty-nine, chapter twenty-four of
13 the Revised Statutes, as amended, although the overseers of
14 the poor of said town have no permit in writing from the
15 governor and council to remove the same into their town.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
