STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT for the protection of deer in the counties of Kennebec, Knox, Waldo, and Lincoln.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall in any manner hunt, take, catch

- 2 or kill any deer in Kennebec, Knox, Waldo and Lincoln coun-
- 3 ties between December first and October fifteenth next fol-
- 4 lowing; and no person shall between October fifteenth and
- 5 December first inclusive next following take, catch or kill
- 6 more than two deer, not more than one of which shall be a
- 7 doe or fawn; nor shall any person have in possession any deer
- 8 or part thereof killed in violation of this section.

- Sect. 2. The penalties provided by the general law for like
- 2 offences shall be the penalties for a violation of this act.
- 3 Except where inconsistent with this act the general law shall
- 4 apply to deer in each of said counties.
