STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THREE.

AN ACT to amend chapter forty-six of the Revised Statutes of 1883.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter forty-six of the Revised Statutes of 1883 is hereby 2 amended by adding thereto the following section: 'Any 3 stockholder of record at the date of the annual meeting of any 4 corporation, organized under the laws of this State, and doing 5 business in this State, may demand of the treasurer of said 6 corporation, a statement in writing, showing in detail, the 7 assets and liabilities of said corporation, at the date of its last 8 annual meeting: also a statement in writing, showing the 9 receipts and expenditures of said corporation, for the year 10 preceding its last annual meeting. The treasurer of said

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11 corporation shall furnish the stockholder making said demand, 12 such statements, within thirty days from the date of the 13 demand; and for every day thereafter that he neglects or 14 refuses to furnish such statement or statements, he shall be 15 liable to the stockholder making such demand, in the sum of 16 one hundred dollars for each and every day, to be recovered 17 by the stockholder making the demand, in an action of debt.'

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The Committee on Judiciary to which was referred the bill, entitled "An Act to amend chapter 46 of the Revised Statutes 1883, relating to the duties of treasurers of corporations have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to report that the same ought not to pass.
