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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE in favor of Maine State Prison.

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*Resolved,* That the sum of thirty-seven thousand one hundred and thirty-six dollars and sixteen cents (\$37,136.16), be and hereby is appropriated for and in behalf of the Maine State Prison, to be expended under the direction and supervision of the governor and council. Six thousand, six hundred and thirty-six dollars and sixteen cents (\$6,636.16), deficiency in insane department; eight thousand dollars (\$8,000), for sewer; two thousand dollars (\$2,000), for repairs of buildings; two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500), to pay for bills and notes outstanding and due; seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500), for current expenses; seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500), for current expenses for the year nineteen hundred and four.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The outlay on sewer was ordered by the prison inspectors, as the board of health ordered the quarry drained. Deficiency in insane account was considered by the governor and council an error in book-keeping, and ordered charged to profit and loss. Repairs on buildings are needed, as some of the buildings leak badly, and the smoke stack is broken.
