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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THREE.

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AN ACT to amend section ten of chapter sixty of the Revised  
Statutes, relating to divorce.

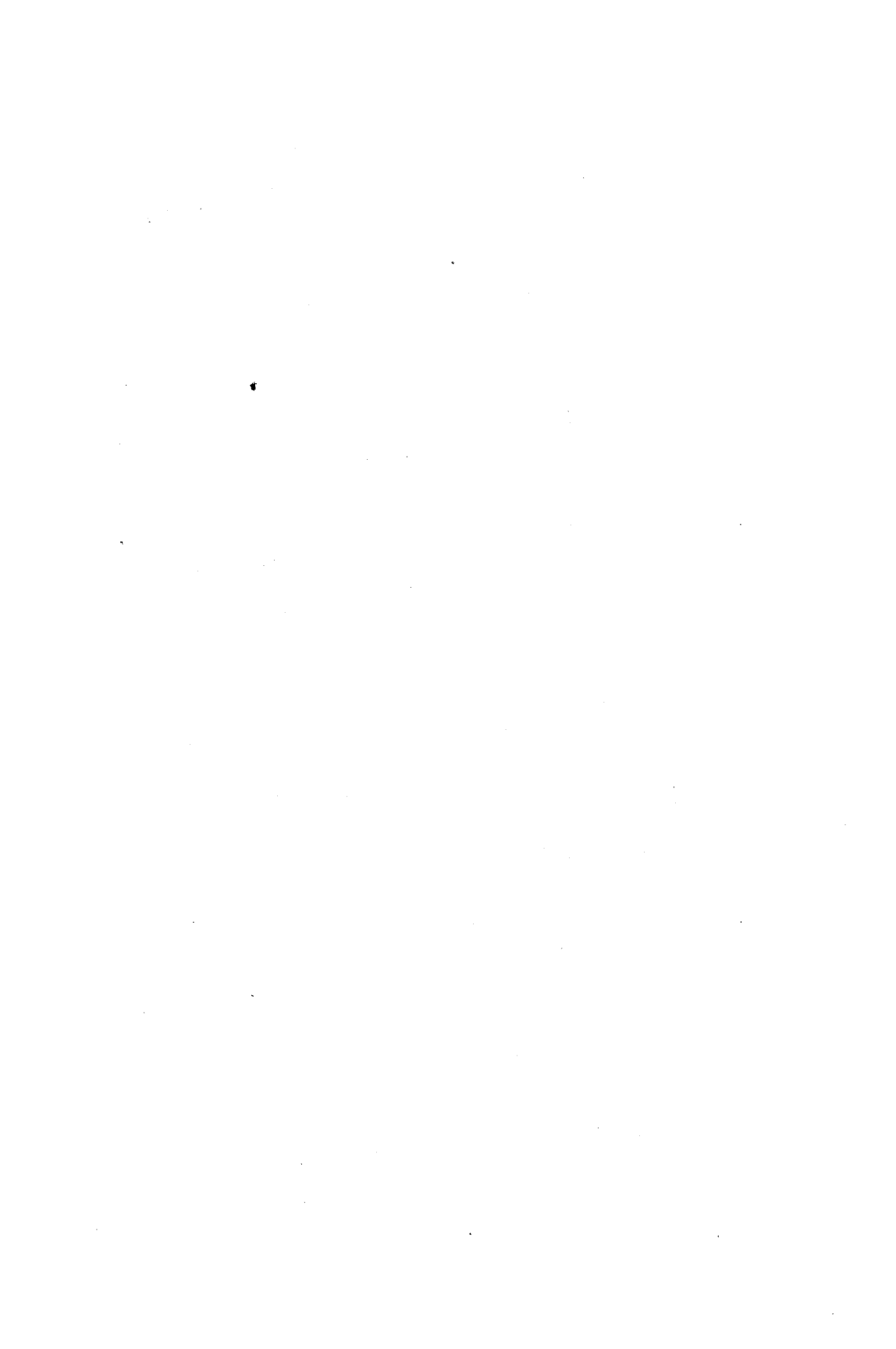
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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section 1. Section ten of chapter sixty of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out all the words in said section and substituting therefor the following :

‘Sect. 10. When a divorce is decreed to the husband for the fault of the wife, he shall be entitled to one-third, in common and undivided of all her real estate, except wild lands, which shall descend to him as if she were dead ; and the court may allow him so much of her personal estate as seems reasonable. In all cases the right, title and interest of the libelee in the real estate of the libellant shall be barred by the decree.’

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
