STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the re-establishment, where necessary, of the boundaries of the lots reserved for public uses in the several plantations and unincorporated places.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be and 2 hereby is appropriated to be expended by the land agent in 3 the re-establishment, where necessary, of the boundaries of 4 the lots reserved for public uses in the several plantations and 5 unincorporated places.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The land agent finds that the lines on many of the public lots have become obliterated, making it impossible to tell the true bounds of the same. In bringing action for trespass upon any of these lots the lines must be clearly defined in order to maintain suit. Several cases of trespass upon the public lots are now pending awaiting the re-establishment of the true lines.
