
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section nineteen of chapter one hundred and fourteen of the Revised Statutes relating to Disclosure Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section nineteen of chapter one hundred and
- 2 fourteen of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by strik-
- 3 ing out the word "five" in the ninth line and inserting in
- 4 place thereof the word 'four,' and in the twelfth line after the
- 5 word "shown" inserting the words 'or fraction thereof,' so
- 6 that said section as amended shall read as follows:
 - 'Section 19. The governor shall from time to time appoint
- 8 disclosure commissioners in different localities within and
- 9 for each county of the State who shall have jurisdiction
- 10 within the county for which they are appointed. Such com-

II missioners shall be attorneys at law and shall hold office for 12 the term of seven years. They shall have an official seal 13 which shall have engraved thereon the name of the commis-14 sioner, the words 'disclosure commissioner' and the word 15 'Maine' and the name of the county and the town or city 16 where the commissioner resides. Each town or city of not 17 more than four thousand inhabitants as shown by the last 18 preceding census of the United States, shall be entitled to 19 one such commissioner and not more than one, and for every 20 additional five thousand inhabitants thus shown, or fraction 21 thereof, an additional commissioner shall be allowed, pro-22 vided that the total number of commissioners in any one 23 town or city shall in no case exceed six. Any commissioners 24 appointed under this section shall have power to renew exe-25 cutions issued by any former commissioner within and for 26 the same county, and executions issued by himself.'
