IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section 113 of chapter 15 of the Revised Statutes relating to the number of trustees of State Normal Schools

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 113 of chapter 115 of the Revised

- 2 Statutes is hereby amended by substituting for the word
- 3 "seven" in the second line of said section the word 'eight'
- 4 and by substituting for the word "five" also in said second
- 5 line the word 'six,' so that said section as amended shall read
- 6 as follows, viz.:

'Sect. 113. Said schools are under the direction of a board

- 8 of eight trustees, six of whom shall be appointed by the gov-
- 9 ernor with the advice and consent of the council, for not
- 10 more than three years under one appointment; and the gov-

11 ernor and State superintendent of public schools are, by
12 virtue of their office, members of the board. Said board has
13 charge of the general interests of said schools; shall see that
14 the affairs thereof are conducted as required by law and by
15 such by-laws as the board adopt; employ teachers and
16 lecturers for the same, and, annually, on the first day of
17 December lay before the governor and council, for the
18 information of the legislature, a financial statement furnish19 ing an accurate detailed account of the receipts and expendi20 tures for the school year preceding.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
