STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to provide in part for the Expenditures of Govern-
ment for the year nineteen hundred and five.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. In order to provide for the several acts and
2 resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money
3 from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary
4 expenditures of government for the current fiscal year of
5 nineteen hundred and five, the following sums are hereby
6 appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the
7 governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is
8 authorized at any time prior to the first day of January
9 next, to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
