STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend chapter three hundred twenty-six of the Private and Special Laws of 1864, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Passadumkeag Boom Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Said chapter three hundred twenty-six is hereby 2 amended by striking out section four and inserting in the 3 place thereof the following section:

'Section 4. To secure the payment of the toll or boomage, 5 said company shall have a lien upon all logs and other lumber 6 by it stopped, secured and rafted, for the expenses of stop-7 ping, securing and rafting the same, and for the other 8 expenses of the company, which lien shall have precedence 9 of all other claims except laborers' liens, and shall continue 10 for thirty days after the logs or other lumber have been

11 rafted, and may be enforced by attachment, but such lien
12 may be discharged by giving a bond, with sufficient sure13 ties, to said company, approved by its board of directors,
14 conditioned that such toll or boomage and other expenses
15 shall be seasonably paid.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
