STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Bar Harbor Hospital, located at Bar Harbor, Maine.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of two thousand dollars to be paid to the Bar Harbor Hos-
3 pital for the running expenses of said institution for the year
4 nineteen hundred and five, and two thousand dollars for the
5 running expenses of said institution for the year nineteen
6 hundred and six.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

First: Quite a number of years ago it was found necessary to provide a place for the care of people who came to Bar Harbor to work, from other parts of the State, and fell sick or met with accident.

Second: About twelve years ago a house was hired and a cottage hospital established. Since then about sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) has been put into hospital work, and now there is an addition under construction which will cost, when equipped, about fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) making a total of about seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) put into this charity, all of which is paid and nearly all by non-residents of the State.

Third: These non-residents have large charities at home, and believe this State will appreciate the above work and appropriate \$4,000—\$2,000 for 1905 and \$2,000 for 1906—toward the running expenses, the same amount as was appropriated for 1903 and 1904.

The cost for maintaining the hospital last year was \$6,736.16. Income from patients about \$2,500, leaving about \$4,200 deficit. Estimated deficit after new wing, \$5,000 for 1905.
