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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

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AN ACT granting additional powers, rights and privileges to  
the Bodwell Water Power Company of Old Town, Maine.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section 1. The Bodwell Water Power Company of Old  
2 Town, Maine, is hereby authorized and empowered to sell and  
3 convey its property and franchises to any other corporation,  
4 and also to purchase the property and franchises of any other  
5 corporation, and also to consolidate with any other corpora-  
6 tion upon such terms and conditions as may be approved by  
7 the stockholders of said companies.

Section 2. The Bodwell Water Power Company is hereby  
2 authorized and empowered to issue its bonds in such form  
3 and in such denominations and payable in such time or times,

4 and bearing such rate of interest, as the board of directors  
5 may deem necessary and convenient, amounting in the aggregate  
6 to not exceeding one million dollars, and to secure the  
7 same by a mortgage of all its property and franchises, in  
8 order to provide means for the purchase and sale of the property  
9 and franchises of any other corporation, or to purchase  
10 and hold the stock of any other corporation if found to be  
11 more convenient so to do in effecting a consolidation or merger  
12 with any other corporation and for making additions and  
13 improvements to its property.

Section 3. In addition to power which it now possesses, the  
2 Bodwell Water Power Company is authorized and  
3 empowered to sell electricity to the Public Works Company  
4 or its successors in the business which it is now carrying on,  
5 and also any railroad company which is now operated by  
6 steam, or its successors, to be used in moving trains or cars  
7 upon the railroad.
