STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to prohibit the hunting of duck on that part of Upper
Kezar pond, situated in Stow and Lovell, Oxford county.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person at any time
2 to use boats or launches of any kind propelled by steam,
3 naphtha, gasolene, electricity, or any other mode than the
4 ordinary row boat or canoe, in chasing, hunting, or gunning
5 any duck or water fowl in any of the waters of Upper Kezar
6 pond, situated in the towns of Stow and Lovell, Oxford
7 county, below Narrows Bridge, so called, in said towns,
8 under a penalty of not less than twenty-five nor more than
9 one hundred dollars for each offence.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
